Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to perform the duties of a Live Fire Instructor In-Charge to the criteria set by the National Fire Protection Association, standard NFPA 1041:

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- prepare a pre-burn plan in compliance with NFPA 1403;
- conduct a pre-burn inspection;
- calculate the minimum water supply required for a live fire evolution in compliance with NFPA 1403;
- identify and assigning instructional tasks and duties in compliance with NFPA 1403;
- conduct a pre-burn briefing session;
- maintain the training environment to safeguard participants;
- conduct a post-burn burn briefing session;
- conduct a post-burn inspection of the structure or prop; and
- complete records and reports in accordance with NFPA 1403.

- Facility requirements, structure or prop considerations
- Observation techniques, inspection and evaluation skills
- · Calculation of water supply requirements
- · Calculation of minimum water flow application rate
- Accountability procedures
- · Coaching and observation techniques
- Pre-burn plan, safety rules, emergency procedures
- Presentation and class management skills
- Signs and symptoms of fatigue and distress
- Evaluation of environmental conditions
- Pre-burn plan, learning objectives
- · Presentation skills, evaluation skills, class management skills
- · AHJ policies, facility requirements, safety practices
- Observation techniques, inspection skills
- NFPA 1403, and AHJ policy on records
- Technical writing and records completion
