This course is designed to strengthen arithmetic and introductory algebra skills which are a foundation for the study of algebra. Topics will be tailored to the individual to address their current skill level, needs and goals. This course is intended for students who wish to refresh their math skills for future math courses, assessments, or employment.

This course is a non-credit course designed to prepare students for formal math courses and assessments. Students may enroll in Math Skills 001 for up to 4 weeks. At the end of this time students will be placed in the appropriate course or be advised to write a formal assessment.
