Description:

The program responds to industry demand for skilled professionals who have a combined skill set of being able to lead adventure trips, teach outdoor skills, and apply sustainable business practices. The adventure industry is a dynamic field where trust in the field, and in each other, is paramount. During this cohort-based program you will build knowledge and experience in these areas as you engage with active and experiential learning opportunities including multi-day trips that challenge you and build technical, leadership, and interpersonal skills. Your business acumen is developed through a balance of business, communication, operations management, and entrepreneurship courses. You also acquire national certifications in a selection of outdoor pursuits appropriate for guiding positions within the adventure tourism industry. This program is appropriate if you wish to grow within an existing adventure tourism operation or interested in developing your own opportunity.

Program Information:

Graduates are prepared to enter the Adventure Tourism industry in both entry-level and supervisory positions.

The Adventure Tourism Business Operations Diploma meets the requirements of the Adventure Tourism Standardized Core Curriculum in BC.

Program Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the program, participants will be able to:

- Explain the importance of the adventure tourism industry in terms of product, service, and business operations – regionally, globally, culturally, economically, and politically.
 - Demonstrate accountability in natural settings for achieving societal goals, human health and quality of life outcomes, sustainable relationships to natural resources, and to upholding land relational cultural integrity and sustainability (i.e. Indigenous sovereignty, kinship relations, and global rights).
 - Identify, analyze, and apply the best available information on ecological science, management practices, interpretation, both Indigenous and western ways of knowing, and public preferences to address contemporary adventure tourism and outdoor leadership opportunities, issues, and engagement with natural settings.
 - Make nature-based adventure tourism decisions using general outdoor skills within applicable laws, policies, and regulations, and across cultural and geographic contexts.
 - Communicate effectively (in both written and verbal) to a variety of audiences, and formats appropriate to context.
 - Work effectively with clients, demonstrating care, inclusion, and customer service; and professionally in groups, as leaders and followers, demonstrating teamwork, emotional intelligence, and conflict resolution strategies and skills.
 - Apply principles and methods for successful management for clients, groups, employees, or volunteers.
 - Demonstrate business planning skills inclusive of budgeting, marketing, personnel management, entrepreneurship, and computer literacy.
 - Demonstrate specific adventure tourism leadership skills in alignment with professional guide certification standards.
