Description:

The Health Care Assistant Program is designed to provide students with opportunities to develop the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary to function effectively as front-line caregivers and be a respected member of the health care team. Under the direction and supervision of a regulated health professional, graduates provide person-centered care aimed at promoting and maintaining the physical, psychological, cognitive, social and spiritual health and well-being of clients and families.

Upon completion of the program, graduates are prepared to work in a variety of practice settings, including home support, assisted living, group homes, complex care, special care units, other home and community care settings and acute care.

Program Information:

The Health Care Assistant program follows the 2023 HCA Provincial curriculum. The HCA Provincial curriculum (2023) is an updated document building on the 2008 and 2015 provincial curriculum. Since 2008, the working environments of HCAs have continued to evolve as the complexity of client populations has continued to increase. More HCAs are being employed in acute care settings and they are providing care for more acute clients than in the past. The curriculum includes information about the values, beliefs, and principles fundamental to the practice of the HCA, as well as foundational principles and concepts required for practice.

English Language Proficiency Requirements

Applicants must demonstrate English Language Competencies as outlined below:

- HCA Program Entry English Language Competency Requirements
 - For applicants with 3 years of full-time instruction in English*: English 10 completion or equivalent.
 - For applicants with less than three years of full-time instruction in English*:
 Standardized English language proficiency test score.
- Applicants who provide evidence of <u>three years of full-time instruction in English</u> must also provide proof of **one** of the following:
 - Completion of Grade 10 English or higher. A minimum of a C grade is acceptable.
 - Completion of college courses determined to be equivalent to Grade 10 English or higher by post-secondary institutions. A minimum of a C grade is acceptable.
 - ACCUPLACER Next Generation Test Results: Reading 230, Writing 230, and Writeplacer 4.
- Applicants who <u>cannot provide evidence of three years of full-time instruction in English</u>
 are required to provide proof of **one** of the following standardized proficiency tests from an

authorized assessment agency, as outlined in the HCA Program Entry – English Language Competency Requirements.

 It is the applicant's responsibility to arrange this assessment through Student Services or an Education Advisor at the College.

*Defined as three (3) years of full-time secondary and/or post-secondary education at a recognized institution on the list of approved English-speaking countries. Secondary education will be considered starting from grade 8. English as a Second Language (ESL) courses will not be considered.

Non-Academic Admission Requirements:

- Core Competency Profile Declaration
- Criminal Record Check (CRC) through the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General
 - HCA students provide care to vulnerable clients in the practice education portion of the program and a clear police certificate from the country of origin is required prior to acceptance into the HCA Program. This applies to all international HCA program applicants, including those currently residing in Canada.
- English Competency Self-Declaration
- Notice of Collection, Use and Disclosure Agreement
- Computer Literacy Recommended.

- CPR Level C certification, current for the duration of the program. Acceptable CPR
 courses must include a face-to-face component and may be combined with a first aid
 course

- Completion of Recognizing and Responding to Adult Abuse (Learning Hub)
